

Vegetation Health Index (VHI)¹


Vegetation health index remains higher as compared to last year



- Indore: Chana output may drop by 15% this rabi season. Chana output in Indore division is estimated to drop by over 15 per cent owing to lower acreage and unfavourable weather, according to industry players, scientists and officials. Indian Agricultural Research Institute, Indore regional station has pegged fall in chana output at around 20 per cent. (Source-<u>Times of India</u>)
- Surplus food stock with government granaries. FCI and government agencies have 50 million tonne rice and 27.5 million tonne wheat, as on March 1 .NAFED currently has 2.5-2.8 million tonne of pulses-- chana, tur, urad and moong and another 0.7 million tonne groundnut and mustard (Source- Economics Times)
